Precaution and Instruction Statements –

- PS-1 Remove Pets, Birds and cover Fish tanks as well as turning off air and filtering pump before treatment and at least 3-6 hours after completion of treatment.
- PS-2 Liquid Insecticides - (surface applications i.e.... lawns, flooring, cabinets etc...) Do not allow children or pets to come into contact with material until surface have dried completely.
- PS-3 Granular Insecticides - (surface applications i.e.... crawl spaces, lawns, basements etc...) Keep children and pets off treated area until material is absorbed into soil or removed.
- PS-4 Insecticide Dust - Insecticide dusts are only used in general inaccessible areas such as wall voids, attics and crawl spaces. Keep children and pets away from treated area until dust has settled. If you see residue dust, do not touch it, contact Hoffman's immediately.
- PS-5 Insect Monitoring - No insecticides are present in our exterior or interior monitors, termite monitors and or glue boards. However, please keep children and pets away, as glue could cause a skin irritation if it comes in contact with skin.
- PS-6 U.V Treatment - Please contact our office before entering an area that has been U.V, Fogged or Mist. There are certain re-entry times that must be followed, and precautions that must be done prior to entering. Please follow postings that were left at entry points of your facility or home.
- PS-7 Bait Placement - All of our rodent bait is placed in "tamper proof" rodent stations and are both locked and secured as required by the NJDEP. Please keep children and pets away from rodent bait and insect bait/ gel placements.

As of November 19, 2001, the New Jersey DEP Pesticide Control Program instituted a new program that requires us to provide customers with information about the pesticides we will be using as part of the pest control program for your property. This "CONSUMER INFORMATION NOTICE" provides you with this information. This CIN lists any label precautions for the pesticide(s) listed below that you should be aware of. You should also be aware that you may request notification of the exact date(s) of any pesticide application, and a copy of the label for each pesticide that will be used.

As the customer, you are entitled by the New Jersey Pesticide Control Regulations to ask us for a copy of the label for each pesticide that will be used on your property, and if you request them, we are required to provide them to you. Furthermore, if this is a contract for termite control, we are required to give you, without your asking, a copy of N.J.A.C. 7:30-10.4 or a Department approved summary of N.J.A.C. 7:30-10.4 regarding proper application of termiticides.
